You may ride multiple tests in a TOC (Test of Choice) class; please specify level & test for each ride. Classes may be combined, split, or dropped & those in italics may be ridden in a small arena at the organizer's discretion. Junior & Senior riders will be divided if entries warrant (at show secretary's discretion). All tests, except USEF Eventing, may be called. All divisions will be run per USEF rules.

ORDER OF GO: Dressage – Three-phase tests will run first, followed by combined tests. **Dressage only tests may run concurrently—in the event we add a second ring.** Show Jumping – will begin after the combined test dressage is finished. Jumper rounds will run first, followed by combined test rounds at each height.

If requested, we will make every effort to modify scheduling in order to accommodate competitors who are hauling in with another competitor. Please indicate trailer-mates on each competitor's entry form.

LEADLINE: To be ridden on the lead line in a snaffle bridle using two hands on the reins. Handler must be an Adult. Rider can be assisted by Handler if needed. Specify Walk/Trot or Walk only on entry.

SHOW JUMPING: Except cross rail and 18" classes, rounds will be timed, no jump off. Cross rail and 18" classes will not be timed, awards to all with clear round.

REFUNDS: Entry fees will be refunded minus Secretary Fee up to Tuesday prior to the show with written notice. No refunds for inclement weather.

CONCESSIONS: Watch the website and Facebook for updates—we currently do not have on-site concessions.

NON-COMPETING HORSES: Will be permitted on show premises (register for Class 34). Additional schooling fees apply if schooling cross country (Class 36).

ARENAS: Dressage will be held in an enclosed sand and fiber arena. Classes 6-13 will be ridden in a standard (large) arena. Warm up will be in the arena, adjacent to the dressage ring, or on grass (optional). Jumping classes will be held in an enclosed grass arena. Warm up on grass (not enclosed). Three-phase will have rolling terrain.

AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded for places 1-6 in each class, except classes 23 and 24 (See "Show Jumping" above). Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in the dressage division (classes 2-15) and in the CT and Three-phase division (CT and Three-phase will be combined for placement. Dressage scores will be weighted as follows: Intro Level --0, Training and USEA tests --+2, First level --+4, Second Level and above --+6.

STABLING: Overnight and day stabling available.

ATTIRE: No coats required. Braiding optional. Tack and apparel should meet USEF guidelines.

HELMETS: Helmets are required for all riders at all times while mounted on a horse.

CROSS COUNTRY: Protective vests are required for all riders.

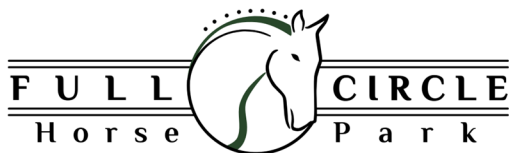
MISCELLANEOUS: All dogs must be on a leash and stay in the show area only. The show will be conducted following USEF/USDF/USEA rules. Management reserves the right to limit entries.

DIRECTIONS: 5555 Wolf Creek Road (Co. Rd 27), Pell City, AL 35128. **USE THE EAST-SHOW GATE ENTRANCE**

From I-20, Exit 156 Eden/Pell City, head south on Highway 78. (DO NOT follow GPS to EXIT 152)

Go 1 mile on Highway 78 and turn right onto Wolf Creek Road (Co. Rd. 27 South). Go 4.5 miles—we are on the right. As you get close, you will see a wooded area on the right—we are the first clearing after that. You will see wood fencing and signs up front.

From Highway 280, turn east onto County Road 43 (Bear Creek Road). This becomes County Road 27, Wolf Creek Road. We are 10 minutes down the road from Vandiver, on the left on Wolf Creek Road just after the intersection with Cook Springs Cutoff Road.

IN CONSIDERATION of the privilege to enter upon and enjoy the land/property under the control of Full Circle Horse Park, LLC, located at 5555 Wolf Creek Road (Co. Rd 27), Pell City, AL 35128, (hereinafter "Stable"), the undersigned hereby agrees as follows:

I _____, the undersigned, understand that I, or my minor child or ward with my consent, have voluntarily undertaken to engage in equestrian activities at the Stable.

I understand that Equestrian Activity, defined to include, but not limited to, riding, training, handling, grooming, care, trailering, and/or showing, involves numerous risks, including bodily injury or death resulting from but not limited to kicks and bites, falling off or being thrown off horses, loss of control, collisions with obstacles, vehicles or other objects, and property damage. I understand that a horse, irrespective of its training and usual past behavior and characteristics may act or react unexpectedly or unpredictably at times, and I voluntarily assume all risks associated with such behavior.

I hereby release Stable, its members, agents, employees, assigns, heirs, executors and administrators, any landowner, and/or affiliated organizations, from any and all claims, causes of action, demands, obligations and liabilities, whether presently existing, or which may in the future accrue, arising from my, and/or my minor child or ward's, participation in Equestrian Activity, to the fullest extent allowed by Alabama law.

I further acknowledge the risks associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, and related variants, and agree to release, hold harmless and indemnify Stable, its members, agents, employees, assigns, heirs, executors and administrators, any landowner, and/or affiliated organizations for any and all risks of contracting COVID-19, or related variants.

I further agree to indemnify and hold harmless Stable from each and every claim, demand, liability or obligation asserted by third parties who might be injured by the actions of the undersigned while the undersigned is engaged in Equestrian Activity whether on the premises or accompanying Stable affiliates and/or personnel off-site.

If signing on behalf of a minor child, I agree to indemnify and hold harmless Stable from each and every claim, demand, liability or obligation asserted on behalf of the minor by a parent or legal guardian.
